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### 2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

**Emergency Overview:** WARNING! Combustible dust - explosion potential. This material is irritating to skin, eyes and respiratory tract. May cause allergic skin reaction.

#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

<b>Handling:</b>	Good hygienic practices should be observed. Work clothes should be washed separately at the end of each work day. Disposable clothing should be discarded with material. <b>Storage:</b>	Store closed containers in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area. Store away from strong oxidizing materials. Avoid exposure to direct sunlight. Do not store near Crystex Insoluble Sulfur. Slowly degrades and releases irritating vapors under warm, humid conditions.
